Space is at a premium. Cut the clutter!

Good lab housekeeping reduces the number of accidents, minimizes risks & consequences of slips, trips, falls, exposure, unplanned reactions, and fire.

- Reducing clutter provides more space for critical research material, making it safer to move around the lab without tripping, or the potential for chemical/biological exposure.
- Limiting or reducing flammable materials (paper, cardboard) reduces the risk of fire.
- Never block emergency exits, fire extinguishers, safety showers, eyewashes, electrical panels or passageways.
- Consider scheduling frequent lab clean-out days (at least quarterly).
- Inspections help keep the lab space clean and pristine. Maintaining an internal inspections program improves the lab safety culture.
- Periodically thaw freezers.
- Make arrangements to service, maintain, or <u>remove broken equipment</u> or laboratory waste.
- Keep a minimum of three feet of clearance (as required by fire codes) between benches and equipment.
- Good housekeeping has obvious safety benefits and can lead to improved productivity.
